

PE and Sport Premium Funding

At Northfold Primary School

PE and Sport play a vital role in the lives of our children at Northfold Community Primary School. Two hours a week are dedicated to physical activity within the curriculum and a wide range of out of school sports clubs are offered throughout the year. On top of this, the children also complete a daily mile. Children have weekly swimming lessons from year 3 and those who have not met National Curriculum requirements at the end of year 4, continue into year 5.

We believe that physical education and sport contribute to the holistic development of young people. Through participation in sport and physical education, young people learn more about team values such as teamwork, fair play and respect for themselves and others.

At Northfold we are keen for our children to understand the positive effects of sport and exercise on their physical and mental health, growth and development. We use sport as a means of providing a healthy environment for our children to experience competition and how to cope with both winning and losing.

What is the Sports Premium?

The PE and Sport Premium continues to be designed to help primary schools further improve the quality of the PE and sport activities offered to pupils.

The Government is providing funding to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. This funding is to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of the PE, physical activity and sport they provide. This includes any carried forward funding.

This means that you must use the PE and sport premium to:

- develop or add to the PE, physical activity and sport that your school provides
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now are sustainable and will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Future initiatives at Northfold using the PE and Sport Premium Funding:

- To provide more opportunities for extra-curricular clubs across both key stages.
- To look into MOKI fitness trackers for all children.

Impact measures:

- An increase in the number of pupils taking part in after school sport.
- An increase in participation rates in activities such as games, dance, gymnastics swimming and athletics.
- An increase in participation by children in competitive school sports.
- Children performing better within PE lessons and have greater confidence which in turn, helps their attainment.
